Founded by Dr. Mei Gechlik in February 2011, the China Guiding Cases Project (CGCP) has enabled legal experts to contribute to the evolution of Chinese case law through ongoing dialogue on China's "guiding cases."

Advised by approximately 40 leading experts and supported by a team of 60 volunteers around the world, the CGCP has, among other products, published:

- All guiding cases.
- English translations of all guiding cases. These translations employ a rigorously developed database of Chinese-English legal terminology.
- Commentaries, in English and Chinese, on the guiding cases and related topics written by judges, legal practitioners, and legal scholars.
