Workshop leaders guide interactive dialogues to identify common elements between justice and the featured field, catalyze commitments to future action, and determine key opportunities for collaboration, including concrete ways in which improved justice and legal tools can help support the delivery of development outcomes. • Persuasively Making the Case for Justice: Participants learn to clearly and persuasively make the case for justice, strengthening their grasp of the key statistics, narrative threads, and effective communication techniques to improve their advocacy skills. • Skill-Building to Increase Impact: Professional development workshops offer practical skills trainings to increase organizational impact such as social impact storytelling, social media management, digital marketing, data visualization, creative financing and fundraising, monitoring and evaluation, and effectively harnessing pro bono support.
