D. Instructions for constructing the income variable:

SURVEYOR: Please use five income range categories, each corresponding broadly to QUINTILES OF THE ACTUAL HOUSEHOLD INCOME RANGE in your country. These figures should be derived from the best available source for your country or from international sources. The data source used should match the requirement of the question, i.e. quintiles of household income for all households (not, for example, for average households or just households with children). The median income should lie in the third quintile. The figures should not appear to be too exact. Minor rounding can be employed to achieve this if necessary. Each country can choose whether to include weekly, monthly, or annual amounts or include more than one of these as appropriate.
